Two London teams made the cut

Three design teams, including two from London, have been shortlisted for the RIBA's Vauxhall Missing Link design competition.

Erect Architecture with J&L Gibbons, Cedric Chausse and Charlotte Portier and Moscow-based Blank Architects were chosen from 100 entries as the finalists.

The judging panel, which included Doreen Lawrence of the Stephen Lawrence Charitable Trust, met to select the shortlist earlier this week.

Chris Law, public realm and development director for the Vauxhall BID, said: "Vauxhall One and RIBA are absolutely delighted with the submissions. To have so many from all over the world is testament to the interest in Vauxhall and Nine Elms on the South Bank. We hope we can do them justice and make Vauxhall a World Class destination with a great public realm."

The shortlisted designs are on exhibition at the Garden Museum and on an Outdoor Trail through the rail arches and parks of Vauxhall until April 19, 10am - 5pm.

The shortlisted will now be invited to meet with the client and discuss their design proposal in more detail and a winner will be selected at the end of May 2013.
